Q: Just your third start on PGA Tour champions with the top 15 in your first start in Houston a few weeks ago. Just a few comments on Kevin having gotten your big toe wet out here and what it's like.

Jason Bohn: Well, I think I'm still getting my toes wet. I'm still learning a lot about it, but I'll be honest, it's probably 50 times better than I thought it could be. Just knowing everybody, knowing all the caddies, I mean, everybody's just so gracious. I mean, it's really welcoming, you know, and which is really cool. It's a lot. It's completely different than the PGA Tour was. So, but it's just great to see everybody I haven't seen in years. I mean, but there's lots of hugs. There's lots of great conversations. And I mean, and it's not so much all about golf, it's more about. Family and friends and like things that have happened in the past, you know, 5 to 10 years, so it's great. Really enjoying it.

Q: Assess your game as you're coming out here. How you feeling? What's going right? What are you kind of working on?

Jason Bohn: When you haven't played competitive golf in a long time, it's hard to kind of get the mind and the game ready to go. So, there's a lot of grinding going on. I'm still working hard on my game and I'm working probably the hardest on my mind. You know, just I'm seeing things that I don't remember seeing when I was playing all the time. I know it's gonna take a little while, and I know I'm gonna kind. Of get back in the swing of things, but my games. Kind of. It's not where I want it to be, but it's kind of it's shaping in the in the form that I want it to come to. So, it's who knows? I mean, golfs. We all know that it's ups and downs, but I'm excited just to have the routines and to work on.

Q: How much you look into what kind of schedule you looking to keep out? Here ideally.

Jason Bohn: I'm gonna play every week that I can possibly play. That's the whole deal for me. I mean, if I'm eligible then I'm playing. I just have so much fun. Even just the practice rounds are great. I've met a lot of great people over my years playing Pro Ams. I don't know, just the camaraderie is so great. It's kind of what I was hoping it would be, but it's actually blown away my expectations to what it really is.

Q: How much experience have you had, if any out here and thoughts on how it sets up for your game?

Jason Bohn: It's a great golf course, a great setup and Regions has done an amazing job putting on this event. I've got a great caddy and we've been together for a long time. He knows his way, so I'm letting him kind of guide me around these places. I'm just looking forward to it every day. I'm anxious to kind of see how it all gets going and I'm excited about it.

Q: Finally, from a charity standpoint, I know you've got Tuscaloosa ties to the state of Alabama. This tournament does such a great job with charity giving back to the communities and so forth. 30 years now since you made your hole in one with the charity in Tuscaloosa. How cool is it to be to be part of an event in Alabama that is so mindful and considerate to charity?

Yeah, there's no doubt. The PGA TOUR Champions give so much back to charity. I heard that they've given over \$20 million to charity just out of this event alone, which is amazing. But you know, every time I come back to the state of Alabama, it doesn't matter why. Coming through, there is a chill that goes through my body. So because of being an Alabama grad and spending my time in Tuscaloosa, it was kind of the jump start to my career. I probably would never play Professional Golf and I hit that home once. There's something about the state of Alabama, so I'm actually kind of disappointed I don't live here. But, I will eventually. I know I'm going to kind of end up in Alabama. I feel there's something about the state that just I'm excited to be here every time I get to.
